Hi Greg,

Attached is the only paperwork that I have received from DFO.

Basically, the form states that DFO does not consider itself a Responsible Authority under CEAA (i.e. DFO does not believe that it is necessary for them to issue a *Fisheries Act* Authorization for the project to proceed - which means that with mitigation measures in place, the project is not likely to cause a Harmful Alteration, Disruption, or Destruction (HADD) of fish habitat).

If you need more in writing from DFO, then I would suggest that you contact Scott Northrup directly.

Environment Canada has not responded to our referral.

Advice re the Sechelt request is still pending.
